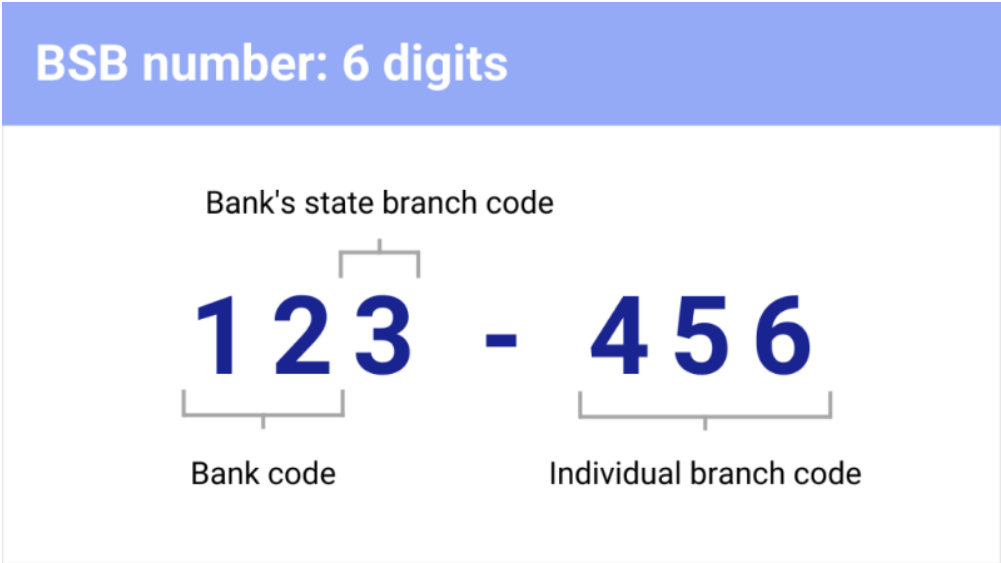


Bank Details Cheat Sheet

A BSB, or Bank State Branch number, is a six-digit code used to identify the specific branch of an Australian bank or financial institution. Some banks have the same BSB number for all branches across the country, while other banks have a different code for each branch. Below is a breakdown of how BSB numbers are formatted.



Entering your bank details in ONB21

Bank Details Explained	For example, if your BSB is 123-456, you will enter the following:
Bank	12
BSB	123-456
Branch Address	Field will update automatically
Account Number	This is a unique number associated with your specific bank account. It's used in conjunction with the BSB to ensure the correct recipient is identified for transactions.
Account Name	The name associated with the bank account, which could be the account holder's name or the name of a business or organisation
