## Campers, travellers urged to 'Get Flood Ready' ahead of weekend rain

With many Victorians heading to the bush this long weekend, VICSES are urging north east locals to check the <u>Vic Emergency app</u> and <u>local forecasts</u> for any hazards.

It follows numerous recent rainfall events in the North East that resulted in minor to moderate flood levels at a number of nearby rivers and creeks. With more rain forecast to fall this weekend over already wet catchments, riverine flooding could develop quickly in popular camping and day trip locations.

North east residents are asked to keep abreast of warnings during Grand Final Weekend, and develop a plan to pack up camp and head to higher ground if necessary.

If you are on the banks of the river this weekend, you should:

- Set a watch zone to include your camp location on the VicEmergency app so you receive warnings.
- If a flood warning is issued over your riverside campsite leave before the water starts to rise.

- Call 132 500 if you need VICSES assistance, or triple zero (000) in a life-threatening emergency.
