Ballarat SES Unit rocked by burglary

A brazen burglary has occurred at VICSES' Ballarat unit, with critical, expensive emergency equipment stolen.

The incident occurred in the early hours of 3 February 2021, with two chainsaws and a MacBook Air taken from an emergency response vehicle. While the burglary has not affected the unit's ability to respond to emergencies and assist the Ballarat community, it has taken a significant emotional toll on Ballarat members.

After a review of security footage, it appears that two alleged thieves worked together, moving methodically throughout the unit. The alleged offenders also wore masks and clothing that obscured their identities.

The items stolen were:

- Silver MacBook Air 13.3", 8-Core M1 7-Core GPU, 8GB/256GB Laptop
- Stihl Magnum 660 Chainsaw, Orange and Grey with 63cm bar and chain
- Stihl 362C Chainsaw, Orange and Grey with bar and chain

Ballarat Police have been made aware of the theft, and are working with the unit's management team to recover the stolen items. If you have any information, please contact Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.
