Glenorchy sees 'substantial' 3.5 magnitude earthquake

An earthquake described as 'sounding like a truck smash' has occurred north of Glenorchy, with over 200 official felt reports.

The 3.5 magnitude tremor occurred at a depth of 11km at 8am on 15 January, with the epicentre in the state's central west near Stawell. This has been revised down from a 3.6 magnitude, reported earlier.

At this stage VICSES has received zero calls for assistance and no reports of building damage. However, a community notification has been issued through the VicEmergency app and website.

The incident is the first notable tremor of 2021, with a handful occurring over the course of 2020.

Quotes attributable to VICSES Regional Agency Commander Andrew Murton:

This 3.5 magnitude earthquake has been felt across a fairly wide area, from Horsham to Ararat, around the Victorian goldfields, as well as the Wimmera-Mallee and Grampians. VICSES, thankfully, has not had to respond to any calls for assistance.

The bulk of felt reports, according to Geoscience Australia, have been in Stawell, where we saw 75, and Ararat, where there were 32 reports.
