Who wants to be a Tsunami Expert?

Theme: Tsunami Warning

In this story the key message is that tsunami are dangerous. Amy is researching them for a school project but Jimmy isn't convinced of their danger. Aren't they just big waves? But Amy's research says otherwise. Tsunami are dangerous and when at the beach, it is important to listen to the warnings and move to higher ground if the warnings are issued. Trev and Jimmy realise that they go to the beach for their holidays and need to be informed. They decide to join Amy in researching more about tsunami.

What students will 'Know and Do':

Students will undertake research on the dangers of tsunami and will complete a poster for sharing with their class.

- 1. View the Li'L Safety Club Natural Disasters advertisement Tsunami Warning
- 2. Ask students to find out what a tsunami is. They can research on the internet or through the library. Through their research on the internet, they should list different sites that contain information about recent tsunami.
- 3. Students should complete the quiz on the **Student Activity Sheet 7A** about tsunami, after reading the **Background Information: Tsunami** or as a class, discussing the contents.
- 4. Ask students to find images of tsunami and develop a poster that warns of the dangers from them.
- 5. The posters could be displayed around the classroom, or could be virtual postcards on a website.
