## PORT FAIRY MAY BE FLOODED BY THE MOYNE RIVER

- Highest Historical Flood.

- Extensive areas are under water. Flooding breaks out of Belfast Lough. Griffiths Street is impassable to the north. Water across Sandspit Road and Albert Road and Goldies Lane. Woodbine Road impacted by flooding. Ross Lane and Bonnets Road are impassable.

- Flooding may impact access for residents located between the Gipps Street Bridge and Woodbine Road (adjacent to the Port Fairy Golf course). These residents may be isolated by floodwater for up to 24 hours with roads impassable. The depth of flooding at the Port Fairy Gardens has increased. 43 properties are subject to flooding, four above floor.

- Many roads and bridges closed. The entrance to the golf course was inundated along most of the northern end of Griffiths Street. Minor inundation may impact the Port Fairy Football Oval, Gardens Caravan Park and the Botanic Gardens.

- Widespread rural farmland flooding, especially north of Princes Highway.

- Inundation was observed close to the corner of Griffiths and Manifold Streets and along Skenes Road.

- Water breaks the banks of the Moyne River causing minor flooding between Belfast Lough and the Gipps Street bridge. Minor flooding in Murray Brook, Reedy Creek, Belfast Lough and Moyne River areas.



## Step 2

Monitor Moyne River (Toolong) water levels

[bom.gov.au/vic/flood](http://bom.gov.au/vic/flood)

- Select 'River Conditions' (above the map)
- Click on Glenelg Hopkins on the right.
- Find the Toolong gauge and hover over it.
- Compare river height to the stream gauge heights on the other side of this card to determine if flooding is likely on your property (see below).

#### Warnings



#### Evacuation

An evacuation is recommended or procedures are in place to evacuate.



#### Emergency Warning

You are in imminent danger and need to take action now. You will be impacted.



#### Warning (Watch and Act)

An emergency is developing nearby. You need to take action now to protect yourself and others.



#### Advice

An incident is occurring or has occurred in the area. Access information and monitor conditions.
